

LA POSTA VECCHIA
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HISTORY

The original villa was built by Prince Orsini in 1640 on top of the remains of an ancient Roman city called Alsium. In 1693, the Orsini family sold their property (The Castle and La Posta Vecchia) to Livio Odiscalchi, another aristocratic family. In 1960 it was bought by Jean Paul Getty that, alongside art historian Federico Zeri, restored it to its original splendour, adding unique furniture from the 15th and 17th centuries, objects and precious artwork acquired from royal homes from around the world. During the restoration, the ruins of a large Roman villa were uncovered which now form the core of the small archaeological museum in the hotel's basement. The villa's recent history began in the 1980s when the private home was purchased by the Sciò family, who used it as their private residence until 1989. In 1990, Roberto Sciò returned it to its original function of hospitality. LA POSTA VECCHIA HOTEL is a member of the *The Leading Hotels of the World*.

THE HOTEL

LA POSTA VECCHIA HOTEL is an elegant five star luxury hotel offering 19 rooms and suites, a heated-indoor pool, a Health & Beauty Club, and a gourmet restaurant, The Cesar. A blend of new and old, the hotel boasts an exclusive 18th century décor, complete with furniture and elaborate tapestries, combined with every modern comfort, a security system and amenity, making it one of the most prestigious hotels in Italy 40-minute drive from Rome's city center.


ROOMS & SUITES

The hotel offers 2 Master Suites, 3 Senior Suites, 3 Junior Suites overlooking the sea or the gardens, 3 Superior Deluxe sea view, 6 Superior Deluxe and 2 Double Standard Rooms. All the rooms are equipped with air conditioning, flat TV, DVD, pay per view, complimentary minibar, safe, complimentary Wi-Fi connection.

MASTER SUITE

Getty Suite

This is the largest suite in the hotel, 96 square meters and was J.P. Getty's private wing when he resided in the Villa. It boasts XVI and XVIIth century furniture, an oak-wood ceiling, King-size bed, white marble bathroom and a wall of windows overlooking the sea.



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Medici Suite

It is said that Mr. Getty's companion lived in this 96 square suite. The sitting room includes a hand-decorated fireplace and a bookcase displaying a rare collection of Meissen plates. The Spanish XVII century King-size bed belonged to the Medici family, and pink marble tub embraced by two marble stairways highlight the outstanding luxury which is the hallmark of the Villa.

SENIOR SUITE

Castello Suite

The view of Odescalchi Castle gives the name to this 60 square meter Senior Suite which also overlooks the sea. There is a precious collection of XVIII century prints illustrating Roman castles lining one wall; the hand-carved green marble tub and sink in the bathroom are truly unique examples of Italian XIX century craftsmanship.

Red Suite

This Suite of 50 square meters has an enchanting view over the lush Italian Garden welcoming the guests at the front of the mansion. From the Red Suite windows, you have the feeling of dominating the entire property. The Red Suite derives its name from the main color of the room furniture. It features two bath rooms: one is completely covered in mirrors and blatantly represents J. Paul Getty's flair in home décor.

Olive Suite

The Olive suite, 55 square meter, on the first floor of the Villa, boasts a spectacular sea-front view. Decorated with Renaissance furniture and antiques from the collection of J.P. Getty, as the XVII century marble sculpture representing a saint in prayer or the late XIXth century medallion depicting the Virgin with child. With its warm tones, the choice of wooden materials, the suite is the perfect place to be lulled by the murmur of the waves.

JUNIOR SUITE

Three are the junior suites, from 40 to 65 square meter, located either on the first and second floor, and only the Colonna Suite can be reached by lift, while the Tower and the Angel only by steps, being located in the tower of the villa. They are warm and inviting to experience a memorable stay, with their outstanding views of the sea or the gardens.

SUPERIOR DELUXE SEA VIEW


These are three luxury rooms, elegant and spacious, from 33 to 38 square meters and have the view of the nearest castle and the sea. The interiors are a result of a precious collection of XVIII century that create an old fashion atmosphere, a revival of Getty's taste.

SUPERIOR DELUXE

These six superior deluxe rooms are located on the first or second floor, only one on the ground floor. Mainly overlooking the Italian gardens. Some are furnished in Renaissance style with antiques, their bathrooms have travertine, marble or ceramic tiled showers or bathtubs. Exclusively for double use. Others are contemporary and comfortable rooms with recently renovated bathrooms

DOUBLE STANDARD

Cozy and warm in their style, these luxury standard rooms of 30 square meters, are located on the second floor and feature garden views, these rooms are furnished in a contemporary style,



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warm and inviting, with ceramic tiled bathrooms-showers or tub. One of these rooms can be adjoining with a superior deluxe room creating a small apartment with two bedrooms and two bathrooms.

THE CESAR RESTAURANT

Starting from November 2015, The Cesar Restaurant is managed by the Executive Chef Antonio Magliulo. His cuisine respects the region's traditions, but he gives his dishes a contemporary twist, with skilful technique in their composition. The majority of the fruit and vegetables served in the restaurant are grown in the hotel's own organic garden; the remaining ingredients come from the finest independent local suppliers and everything served and delivered to room or table - down to the bread, pastries, and even the jams and the condiments - is expertly made by Antonio and his team.

LPV HEALTH & BEAUTY CLUB

The LPV Health & Beauty, conveniently located by the covered swimming pool, uses signature products by Officina Profumo Farmaceutica di Santa Maria Novella and, with a holistic approach, offers treatments that combine the classic medicine with the alternative and most recent therapies. To purify the body and mind deep down, the caldarium, a steam room, where staff remove dead skin cells using a horsehair glove, easing away physical fatigue and mental stress, is the best option.

BEACH AND POOL CLUB

Soaking up the warm rays of the setting sun over the sea, a cocktail in hand, is all the relaxation some visitors desire. For an early morning swim, there's the hotel's heated swimming pool; for a late afternoon dip, the crystal clear water of the sea; for a tranquil afternoon, the deck chairs on the terrace or on the beach

MEETINGS & INCENTIVES



Hotel guests can borrow bicycles to visit the WWF Palo Laziale Oasis just one kilometer from the hotel. Guests can also canoe on the bay or, to explore the Roman coastline by boat. Rome is only 40 minutes drive and excursions to the old Etruscan city of Tarquinia or to Cerveteri, Ostia Antica and Tivoli can be arranged with multilingual guides.
